

Netball Queensland Competitions Overview

Objectives

- To provide <u>affordable</u> and <u>accessible</u> competition structures that enable players, coaches and officials of all levels to pursue their dreams
- To provide access for all to an <u>appropriate</u> standard of netball, ensuring participants can reach a level where they are challenged, but don't always dominate or are consistently out of their depth;
- To ensure an appropriate volume of netball to ensure participants can meet their training and playing requirements and maintain a lifelong passion for the game.
- To reduce the impact of cost as an inhibitor to participation and that cost does not prevent talented player, coaches and umpires from further selection.
- Ensure all competition structures have a clear purpose and fit into the broader context of NQ Competitions to aid with player, coach and umpire retention and progression as appropriate

Queensland Premier League (QPL)	Primary Focus: Participation The Queensland Premier League exists to provide a multi-division state wide competition to determine the best Association teams in Queensland. It caters for netballers turning 15 or older in the year of competition and includes Open, Men's, 17U, 19U and Mixed Divisions. The QPL culminates in a QPL State Finals weekend where the winning teams come together from around Queensland to battle it out to be crowned State Champions. Vicki Wilson Cup/Shield (VW)	Primary Focus: Participation Netball Queensland's Vicki Wilson Cup and Vicki Wilson Shield aims to be the premier netball competition for high schools across Queensland. It is an inclusive competition open to any high school within ten regions spanning Queensland. The Vicki Wilson Cup is open to grades 7-12; while the Vicki Wilson Shield is open to grades 7-9.
