The Opportunity

Our Diamond Spirit program is a holistic community engagement program which uses netball as a vehicle to empower and educate Indigenous girls in remote and regional communities. Diamond Spirit has already made a positive impact in the lives of more than 1,000 participants in the Far North Queensland communities of Aurukun, Mapoon, Napranum and Yarrabah.

Participants have been engaged in a range of fun, educational and practical workshops as part of the program, which uses netball to encourage and reward healthy living and engagement in education.

The Diamond Spirit and Inclusion Programs Lead is the face of this and other inclusion programs at the community level. You will lead the delivery of our Diamond Spirit Program and other identified Inclusion projects across Queensland communities with a specific focus on building local capacity through innovative program design. Your work and that of your colleagues will directly contribute to the ongoing sustainability of netball throughout indigenous and multicultural Queensland whilst engaging, empowering and supporting the development of our participants.

The Role

The key areas of responsibility for the Diamond Spirit and Inclusion Programs Lead include, but are not limited to:

- Support the delivery of Netball Queensland's Diamond Spirit program, and other identified priority Inclusion projects across Queensland including the Connecting Through Sport (CTS) program with Multicultural Australia.
- Develop effective strategies that will increase the capacity of communities, including remote Indigenous
 communities to deliver community netball, through innovative coach and umpire development programs
 utilising appropriate resources to suit different audiences.
- Assist in the development and delivery of Cultural Diversity Training that enables a uniform approach but is flexible to be needs based for differing organisations.
- Take a lead role in managing and expanding the local workforce through effective relationships that deliver positive outcomes for community sport.
- Assist in gathering qualitative and quantitative data that tracks participation data and measures the effectiveness of Diamond Spirit and other inclusion projects.
- Support the development of new and existing 'remote community clubs' to ensure long term sustainability of programs in remote communities.
- Manage local partnerships with priority partners that increase participation opportunities for Aboriginal and Torres Strait islander people and other identified target groups aligned to Netball Queensland's strategic priorities.
- Provide timely reports to the Manager Diamond Spirit, Products and Programs to ensure program outcomes are achieving agreed key performance measures.
- Any other tasks required by Netball Queensland to achieve program outcomes.

Due to the nature of the position and the sport industry, evening, weekend work and travel will be required from time to time. =You will also be required to travel to remote Indigenous communities regularly throughout the year

You must hold a Working with Children (Blue) Card or be able to obtain one as soon as possible.

Who are you?

You are someone who has:

- A strong personal brand which personifies Netball Queensland's values driven culture of excellence based on trust;
- Knowledge and understanding of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander culture, traditions, history, lifestyle and health particularly in relation to gender cultural beliefs, family and communities.
- Demonstrated ability to work effectively with CALD communities and target groups specifically refugees, migrants, international students and women

- Demonstrated high level interpersonal skills and ability to work with Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander clients, communities, and members from diverse cultural backgrounds
- Demonstrated ability to articulate and act within the appropriate cultural context for number of different cultural groups, with the purpose of building cultural capacity within the netball system.
- Ability to be flexible and adaptable in a challenging yet rewarding working environment
- Be an influential leader across all areas of our business to support a truly inclusive and diverse workplace environment

- Knowledge and understanding of Netball programs at a community level
- Effective time management skills with a demonstrated ability to work autonomously and meet multiple deadlines and commitments
- Proven ability to work autonomously and achieve outcomes under minimal supervision.
- Minimum Foundation level coach accreditation or willingness to obtain and further develop your netball coaching knowledge.
- Able to work flexible hours to suit community needs, this may include weekends and evening work.
- Willingness to travel at least once a term to deliver training and events in remote communities.
