Primary Purpose of Position

This is a fantastic opportunity for a dynamic and energetic person to engage day to day with Netball Associations, Netball Clubs, players, coaches, and umpires. This role includes delivery of Netball Queensland programs and products within schools and the broader netball, to deliver on Netball Queensland's strategic and operational priorities while fostering positive relationships in our community.

Community Development Officers are often the first Netball Queensland touch point for many in our netball community, therefore it is essential that they demonstrate our values and associated behaviours as they deliver programs to help participants to strengthen their connection with netball and develop a love of the game.

This role will support Netball Queensland's vision to drive the following outcomes:

- Increase participation in netball at all levels across Queensland
- Embrace inclusion and diversity within our netball competitions, programs, and community
- Improved engagement with Netball Queensland Associations and Clubs
- Attract, develop, and retain community and volunteer coaches to support the delivery of netball
- Attract, develop, and retain community umpires and officials to support the delivery of netball.
- Increase the number of affiliate organisations through engagement with schools, indoor venues, PCYC and YMCA locations.
- Constructive feedback through direct and indirect interface with participants, families, and stakeholders.

In addition to demonstrating competence in the key areas of responsibility, the role of Community Development Officer will require a range of personal and professional skills and experiences, including:

- Demonstrated experience in sports administration and/or understanding of volunteer sporting organisations
- Previous experience in the delivery of sport participation, community engagement and coaching are desirable.
- Demonstration of collaborative and leadership qualities including the ability to motivate others, teach, solve conflicts, balance competing priorities and maintain vital relationships with a diverse range of stakeholders
- Understanding of the Not-for-Profit sector, particularly within a sporting context.
- Current Foundation Coaching Accreditation (or willingness to obtain before commencing employment)
- First Aid and CPR certificate (or willingness to obtain before commencing employment)
- High level of computer and technology literacy with a focus for maximising opportunities through innovation and technology.
- Ability to set priorities, plan work programs, meet deadlines and manage time effectively, or superior planning, scheduling, and organisational skills
- Strong interpersonal, organisational and project management skills.

• Excellent communication skills including face to face, telephone, written reports, and general correspondence.

Personal

- A strong personal brand which personifies Netball Queensland's values driven culture of excellence based on trust.
- Sharing Netball Queensland's values of collaborative, professional, accountable, respectful, and innovative.

The key areas of responsibility for the Community Development Officer include, but are not limited to:

- Develop and build strong relationships within Netball Associations, clubs, and schools to support and facilitate the growth in participation and enjoyment of Netball.
- Deliver and / or facilitate beginner coach development workshops with a view to support, upskill and retain grassroots netball coaches.
- Deliver and / or facilitate beginner umpiring and official's development workshops with a view to support, upskill and retain them within our netball community.
- Coordinate and deliver Netball Queensland community programs, (Sporting Schools, NetSetGO) and school holiday clinics and camps.
- Promote diversity and inclusion in the netball community by supporting and delivering on Netball Queensland's vision that anyone can play.
- Be an active and visible presence in netball communities through structured and regular Association, Club, and school visits.
- Support Netball Queensland, Associations and Clubs at community netball events, competitions, and carnivals, including event delivery.
- Foster relationships with organisations engaged in pursuits that are complementary to the objects of Netball Queensland, including schools, tertiary institutions, and multi-sport associations, such as Police Citizen Youth Clubs.
- Report to Netball Queensland on any risks or issues in the community.
