

Netball Queensland Beginner Umpire Recommended Progression

Pre-Umpiring:

Skills	Role of the umpire
	Basic rule knowledge
	Basic umpiring techniques
Learning	Read Rules of Netball
	Complete Rules of Netball Exam
	Beginner Umpire Workshop (run by club/association or NQ)
Mentoring	Experienced mentor to attend practice matches
	Mentor may need to "shadow" umpire
Competitions	Practice matches/training session match play

Supervised Umpire:

Skills	Confidence to make decisions
	Clear and loud communication
	Application of basic rules e.g. out of court, offside
	Application of basic umpiring techniques e.g. positioning
Learning	Foundation Umpire Online Course
Mentoring	Experienced mentor to attend matches
	Mentor to watch from sideline and provide feedback at breaks
Competitions	Junior (11-12yrs) Fixtures or Senior Social Netball
	Players should have basic understanding of the rules
	NOT Net Set Go or other modified rules formats

Novice Umpire:

Skills	Hand Signals
	Correct decisions regarding basic rules
	Making decisions regarding more complex rules e.g. contact
	Continued development of umpiring techniques
Learning	Rules Discussions
	Observation of other umpires
Mentoring	Experienced mentor to attend matches
	Feedback should focus on C Badge competencies
	Use of feedback framework e.g. good/better/how
Competitions	Junior Fixtures or Social Netball
	NOT Net Set Go or other modified rules formats



Beginner Umpire Mentor Behaviours

Effective Beginner Umpire Mentors Will:

- Know and understand the Rules of Netball
- Be good communicators
- Give their full attention to the umpire they are mentoring
- Be positive and encouraging
- Give concentrated feedback based on the badging competencies
- · Coach the umpire, not umpire the game for them

Moving Towards C Badging

When an umpire has developed their confidence and is able to manage ladies and/or men's games (players aged 15+) on their own, mentors should begin to evaluate whether the umpire is ready to be assessed for their C Badge. It is important to remember that the C Badge is an entry-level badge only. Testers should not expect perfection or mastery and should focus on assessing umpires based on the listed competencies.

Netball QLD discourages the use of unofficial accreditations/awards that precede C Badging e.g. Association Awards, Bronze/Silver/Gold systems. These awards often present an unnecessary obstacle for umpires progressing into the accreditation pathway. Associations and clubs should seriously consider the need for these awards and should ensure there is clear distinction between the award criteria and the C Badge competencies.
