



HIGHLIGHTS

FIRST NATIONS ENGAGEMENT PLAN

Developed a plan to support ongoing relationships that optimise First Nations insights and expertise for the success of NQ's Innovate RAP.

ADDRESSING ENTRY BARRIERS TO HP PATHWAYS

Increased touch points with First Nations players including at Junior and Senior State Age, strengthened support for First Nations feeder programs and improved targeted comms.

PUBLIC DISPLAYS OF ALLYSHIP

Leveraged NQ platforms on days such as Australia Day and National Sorry Day to highlight the healing that still needs to be done to promote reconciliation.

CULTURAL SAFETY SYMBOL

Displayed prominently at Firebirds home games and NQ events, with supporting information accessible through the RAP and office signage.

NATIONAL RECONCILIATION WEEK (NRW) EVENTS

Registered and delivered three NRW events in 2025 — the Firebirds First Nations Dress Presentation & Yarning Circle, an internal Lunch & Learn, and the Diamond Spirit Educate stakeholder event and the Celebrating Reconciliation Diamond Spirit Educate stakeholder engagement event (supported by the QLD government).

CULTURAL SAFETY IN COACHING

Developed a cultural safety training program for NQ's coaching workforce, to be introduced in 2025 and compulsory for all NQ coaches by 2026.

CULTURAL TRAINING

Produced an educational video for staff and NQ Affiliates promoting anti-racism and allyship.

STAFF ENGAGEMENT

Ongoing communication and recognition of RAP milestones and First Nations days of significance through Town Halls, Lunch & Learns, Teams channels, executive updates and annual Welcome to Country and Smoking Ceremony.
